

RSS HOW-TO GUIDE **RSS**

RSS is a free and easy way for you to receive information from your favorite website or blog. No more searching for site updates.

Download a free RSS reader (which will also read ATOM or XML feeds).
We suggest: www.rss-reader.com
The RSS reader sits by your clock (bottom right corner of your computer).

There are two ways to ADD a feed to your RSS reader.

This feed (below) is the 'Sounddogs.com Sound Effects Recording Blog.'

HIGHLIGHT the link below, (then right click your mouse) and COPY:

Go to your RSS reader and click on **ADD** (the green 'plus' sign) > NEXT.
Great! You will now travel around the world with Rob Nokes recording sound effects.

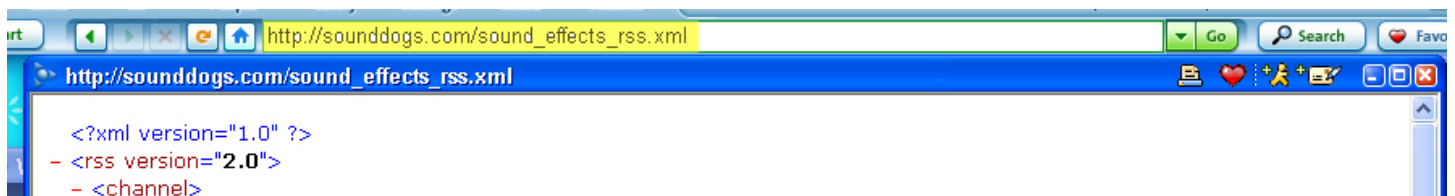
The second way to add an RSS feed is to go to your favorite site:

<http://www.sounddogs.com>

On the top right corner you will see: **RSS**
Click on this orange button – you will see all sorts of odd text.

Look in the search bar and you should see: (I've highlighted it in yellow for you):

HIGHLIGHT the entire link, (then right click your mouse) and COPY.
Go to your RSS reader and click on **ADD** (the green 'plus' sign) > NEXT.
Great! You will now get important sound effects information and the Sounddogs.com newsletter.
